# **NYSSMA Mission Statement**

The purposes of the New York State Society of Medical Assistants are to enable medical assisting professionals to enhance and demonstrate the knowledge, skills, and professionalism required by employers and patients; to protect the medical assistants' right to practice; and to to promote effective, efficient healthcare delivery.

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## 1 ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be the *New York State Society of Medical Assistants*. It is a constituent society affiliated with the *American Association of Medical Assistants*, hereafter known as *AAMA*.

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## ARTICLE II – *PURPOSE*

9 **Section 1.** The purpose of the *New York State*10 *Society of Medical Assistants* is to enable
11 medical assisting professionals to enhance and
12 demonstrate the knowledge, skills and
13 professionalism required by employers and
14 patients; protect medical assistants' right to
15 practice; and promote effective, efficient health
16 care delivery through optimal use of multi17 skilled *CMA (AAMA)*).

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#### **Section 2.** Other objectives shall be:

A. To stimulate a feeling of fellowship and cooperation among component chapters;

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B. To seek to continually improve the knowledge and skills of medical assistants for the benefit of patients and professional colleagues.

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# ARTICLE III - ORGANIZATIONAL POLICY

This society is hereby declared to be non-profit. It is not nor shall it ever become a trade union or collective bargaining agency. No person otherwise qualified for membership shall be denied membership. No person who participates in the activities of organizations whose purpose is to overthrow the government of the United States shall be a member.

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# 41 **ARTICLE IV** – 42 **COMPONENT CHAPTERS**

Component chapters are those county or district associations of medical assistants contained within the State of New York.

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**Section 1.** An association may become a component chapter of the New York State 49 Society of Medical Assistants by applying for 50 membership to the Executive Board and 51 submitting three copies of its bylaws. Following 52 approval of the Executive Board, the component 53 chapter shall be notified of its affiliation with the 54 **New York State Society of Medical Assistants** 55 by the president.

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57 **Section 2.** The bylaws of a component chapter shall not be in conflict with those of the **New** 59 **York State Society of Medical Assistants** or those of the **American Association of Medical Assistants.** These bylaws supersede those of a component chapter.

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64 **Section 3.** Members of component chapters 65 which have been approved by the Executive 66 Board at least sixty (60) days prior to an annual 67 meeting shall be able to vote in the General 68 Assembly as provided in **ARTICLE XIV.** 

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70 **Section 4.** Component chapters shall consist of 71 eight or more active/associate members. The 72 charter of a component chapter may be 73 suspended by a majority vote of the Executive 74 Board if the minimum membership is not met at 75 the time of the annual meeting. A charter shall 76 be automatically revoked if suspended for two 77 consecutive years.

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Section 5. The charter of a component chapter may be revoked by a three-fourths vote of the Executive Board if it is found guilty of conduct deemed in violation of the bylaws of the New York State Society of Medical Assistants.

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# ARTICLE V - MEMBERSHIP

\*B. ASSOCIATE:

An associate member shall be a medical

assistant who is not yet a CMA

(AAMA) and who does not fall under any other category of membership.

#### \*C. SUSTAINING:

Anyone who has been an active or associate member for at least two years, and who has retired from medical assisting, is eligible for sustaining membership. This membership shall be forfeited if not renewed annually.

#### \*D. STUDENT

A student member:

- 1. Shall be enrolled in a medical assisting program accredited either the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs or the Accrediting Bureau of Health Education Schools.
- 2. Shall be limited to a one time enrollment, selecting either a one-year or a two-year membership term.

#### E. LIFE

A life member shall be an active member who has had life membership conferred by a two-thirds vote of the Executive Board for outstanding service to the Society. There shall be no more than two life memberships conferred in a five (5) year period.

#### F. HONORARY

An honorary member shall be one who has aided in furthering the objectives of this society and shall be elected by a two-thirds vote of the Executive Board.

#### \*G. AFFILIATE

An affiliate member shall be one who is not eligible for another category of membership but who is interested in the profession of medical assisting.

# **Section 3.** Privileges:

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A. Active and NYSSMA Life members are eligible to serve as officers, committee chairmen, and voting members of the General Assembly and delegates and alternates to the AAMA House of Delegates. **Associate and Sustaining members** are eligible to serve as committee chairmen and voting members of the General Assembly.

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B. Each chapter shall determine the chapter privileges of its members according to its needs.

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#### **Section 4.** Revocation:

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Any member who has had their CMA (AAMA) credential revoked by the Certifying Board as provided by the Certifying Board Disciplinary Standards and Procedures for CMA (AAMA) 26 (see <a href="www.aama-ntl.org">www.aama-ntl.org</a>) will immediately lose their membership and all privileges attached thereto, and shall not be allowed reinstatement unless the revocation of the credential is rescinded by the Certifying Board. No refund of any dues amount paid will be made.

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## ARTICLE VI-FINANCES

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**Section 1.** The annual dues of the *New York* State Society of Medical Assistants shall be set General Assembly recommendation of the Executive Board. Dues shall become due and payable November 1 and 40 shall be delinquent if not postmarked or submitted electronically to the AAMA Executive Office by December 31(the controlling time is that of sending not that of receiving).

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D. Life and honorary members are Not required to pay Society dues.

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E. New members joining on or after September 1<sup>st</sup> shall pay dues for the appropriate category, which shall be credited to the following year.

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> 62 Section 2. The New York State Society of 63 Medical Assistants will offer reciprocity to AAMA members transferring membership from another constituent society and/or component chapter of the AAMA. The transferring member shall present proof of current AAMA membership status.

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Section 3. Membership belongs to the individual and shall be non-transferable.

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Section 4. To ensure the financial stability of 74 the New York State Society of Medical 75 Assistants, special emergency assessments may be made on the membership and must be 76 77 authorized by a two-thirds vote of the Executive Board.

#### **Section 1. Term of Office:**

- A. The term of office for the president, vice president and immediate past president shall be for one administrative year or until the close of the annual meeting of the *General Assembly* following the election to office. - B. The term of office for the secretary and the treasurer shall be for one administrative year or until the close of the annual *General Assembly* following the assumption of office. These officers may be re-elected to the respective office.

A two-thirds vote of the Executive Board shall be necessary to effect any disciplinary action.

26 **Section 5.** The **Executive Board** shall suspend the charter of a component chapter if it does not meet the minimum membership requirement. 29 The Executive Board may revoke the charter of a component chapter if the chapter is found guilty of conduct deemed in violation of these bylaws.

**Section 6.** The **Executive Board** shall meet in 35 June, September or October and January or 36 February following the meeting of the *General* 37 Assembly of the New York State Society of 38 Medical Assistants. A special meeting of the 39 Executive Board may be called by the president, or upon the written request of four members of the Executive Board.

43 Section 7. The Executive Board shall be 44 allowed to vote by teleconference, by e-mail, mail ballot, online or video conferencing 46 between meetings of the Executive Board with a majority vote ruling. Mail must be sent first class and instructions shall allow ample time, not less than 14 days, for reply.

51 **Section 8.** A quorum shall consist of the 52 majority of the members of the Executive 53 Board.

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# 55 ARTICLE XII – *JUDICIAL* 56 **BOARD**

58 Section 1. The Judicial Board shall consist of 59 five past presidents of the New York State 60 Society of Medical Assistants and the 61 Parliamentary Advisor who shall be ex-officio 62 member without vote.

- A. Each year the president shall appoint, with the approval of the Executive Board, one member to serve a five year term.
- B. No member shall serve more than two terms, but a member appointed to serve an un-expired term shall not be regarded as having served a a term unless serving three or more years.
- C. The newly appointed member serves as Vice Chair of the Judicial Board for the year of appointment. During the subsequent year, this member serves as the Chair of the Judicial Board.
- D. In the case of an unforeseen vacancy on the Judicial Board, the President, with the approval of the Executive Board shall appoint a past president whose membership see Article V **Section 3** to fill the vacancy.

90 **Section 2.** The judicial power of the *New York* State Society of Medical Assistants shall be vested in the Judicial Board. Its decisions may be appealed to the Judicial Council of the American Association of Medical Assistants.

Section 3. The Judicial Board shall have jurisdiction in all questions involving interpretation of these bylaws.

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30 **Section 3.** At least 60 days before the annual meeting of the General Assembly of the New 32 York State Society of Medical Assistants, or 33 earlier if requested by the President, the 34 chairman of each committee shall submit to the 35 President a written report of the charge to the 36 committee and the activities and actions taken by the committee during the year, and any 38 recommendations it wishes to present to the General Assembly.

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Section 4. Special Committees may be 42 created by the president, Executive Board, and/or the General Assembly when deemed 44 necessary to carry on the work of the *New York* 45 State Society of Medical Assistants. Their composition and functions shall be in accordance with the authorization of their appointment. The president shall appoint chairmen and members with the approval of the 50 Executive Board and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees

# 52 ARTICLE XIV -53 **GENERAL ASSEMBLY**

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55 **Section 1.** The governing body of the *New* 56 York State Society of Medical Assistants shall be the General Assembly, which shall have the 58 authority to determine its policies and the power to amend bylaws, set dues and act upon such business as may be presented.

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**Section 2.** The composition of the *General* Assembly shall be all active, associate, and sustaining members whose dues postmarked or submitted electronically to the 66 AAMA Executive Office by December 31st (the controlling time is that of sending, not that of receiving) and life members of the New York State Society of Medical Assistants.

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> 71 **Section 3.** The **President** shall appoint the 72 Credentials Committee, Teller, Pages, and such other committees as necessary for the organization and operation of the General Assembly, and shall report the presence of a auorum.

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A. The Credentials Committee shall verify the legal voting status of the members attending the General Assembly. The committee shall determine the total legal votes, the number of a majority vote, and the number for a two-thirds vote.

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B. Any emergency resolutions shall be Submitted to the President by 8 pm on the day preceding the opening of The General Assembly.

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**Section 4.** The annual meeting of the *General* Assembly shall be held during the annual meeting of the New York State Society of Medical Assistants.

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A. Special meetings of the General Assembly may be held at the call of the Executive Board by written notice to all qualified voting members of the New York State

1 Society of Medical Assistants at 2 least 30 days in advance of the 3 meeting.

5 **Section 5.** In the event of an administrative 6 emergency, declared by the Executive Board, 7 the Executive Board may take a vote of all 8 qualified voting members by mail instead of 9 calling a special meeting of the *General Assembly*. Ballots shall be sent *First Class* mail 10 by the President and returned to the chairman of 12 the Tellers. The ballots shall be sent in ample 13 time, not less than 14 days, for reply from the voting member.

Section 6. At all meetings of the *General*Assembly, a quorum shall be the majority of
the members present and voting.

## 20 ARTICLE XV – MEETINGS

22 **Section 1.** There shall be an annual meeting 23 of the *New York State Society of Medical* 24 *Assistants* at a place and time approved by 25 the Executive Board.

27 **Section 2.** Special meetings of the *General* 28 *Assembly* shall be held at the call of the 29 Executive Board as outlined in **Article XIV**, 30 **Section 4**, **A**.

# 32 ARTICLE XVI – 33 *PUBLICATION*

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35 **Section 1.** There shall be an official 36 publication of the *New York State Society of Medical Assistants* and the Executive Board 38 shall establish its editorial policies.

40 **Section 2.** The editor shall be appointed by the 41 president with the approval of the Executive 42 Board. The official responsibilities of the editor 43 shall begin at the close of the annual meeting of 44 the *General Assembly* of the *New York State* 45 *Society of Medical Assistants*.

47 **Section 3.** The editorial staff shall be 48 appointed by the president with the approval of 49 the Executive Board.

51 Section 4. The publication shall present 52 educational organizational articles and information, and shall serve as the official 53 history of the New York State Society of 54 Medical Assistants. A historian may be appointed by the president with the approval of 56 57 the Executive Board.

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# ARTICLE XVIII -10 **PARLIAMENTARY** 11 **AUTHORITY**

The Bylaws of the New York State 14 Society of Medical Assistants and/or the Bylaws 15 of the American Association of Medical 16 Assistants shall govern all meetings of the 17 society and the Executive Board. In cases where the bylaws of either organization do not cover an issue, the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order (Newly Revised) shall be used.

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A. There shall be a Parliamentary **Advisor** appointed by the president with the approval of the Executive Board.

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# 30 ARTICLE XIX –

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34 **Section 1.** In the event of dissolution of the *New* 35 York State Society of Medical Assistants, after payment of all liabilities, none of the assets shall be distributed to any member, but shall be 38 transferred to a medical or charitable institution or projects designated by a majority of the 40 eligible voting members at a meeting called for the purpose of dissolution. The president shall 42 notify the Executive Office of the American 43 Association of Medical Assistants no later than 10 days after the meeting in which dissolution was voted.

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**Section 2.** In the event of the dissolution of the 48 New York State Society of Medical Assistants, a financial accounting of the finances shall be due 50 in the Executive Office of the American 51 Association of Medical Assistants, no later than 52 ninety (90) days after this society is dissolved.

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# 54 ARTICLE XX -55 AMENDMENTS OR 56 **SUSPENSIONS**

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58 **Section 1.** These bylaws may be amended, or sections may be suspended, by a two-thirds vote of the General Assembly of the New York State 61 Society of Medical Assistants.

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63 **Section 2.** All proposed amendments and/or 64 proposed suspensions of these bylaws must be 65 published to the eligible voting members of this 66 society at least 30 days before the meeting they 67 are to be voted upon.
